

Haunted Calgary Ready to Unleash Terror Again

The cesspool of human society: a ghoulish collection of creeps who would make your skin crawl and your stomach turn. Evil so wicked that even the most macabre will shudder. The promise of fresh victims calls to these soulless entities as they gather at Calgary's Halloween tradition in the northwest community of Rocky Ridge.

Haunted Calgary's approximately 10,000 square foot walkthrough haunted yard attraction has been designed, built and operated by volunteers for the enjoyment of the community for over 25 years. With a cast of approximately 60 actors, some Hollywood-scale animatronic monsters, and uniquely handcrafted sets, the attraction is guaranteed to be a new experience each year.

The attraction gives back to the community in many ways. Seasoned volunteers offer hands-on training for youth, women and under-served populations, include safe power tool operation, basic construction skills, painting and set design, acting, special effects makeup, administration and customer service, etc. Those interested in volunteering can visit www. hauntedcalgary.org for more information.

Haunted Calgary raises funds for animal rescue and food for the food bank through its gate admissions. Cash, Visa, MasterCard, Debit Tap, Google Pay, and Apple Pay will be accepted at the gate.

Haunted Calgary brings the community together, attracting over 5,000 visitors over three nights and for many has become an annual family Halloween tradition. The "Low Scare" during daylight hours features few (or no) actors and less spooky lighting for the little ones and the faint of heart. But if you're brave enough, we highly recommend you visit during full scare hours in the evening. Parental discretion is advised.



CanSkate (Learn-to-Skate) Program

The **CanSkate Program** is Skate Canada's learn-to-skate program designed for beginner skaters, ages 4 and up, which focuses on the development of fundamental skating skills and movements. Our program encourages skaters to learn in a fun, safe, positive environment while receiving constant feedback from our coaching team for better progression. During the skating season, coaches will use their discretion to progress skaters through appropriate CanSkate levels according to their skating ability. Those who show potential and interest may choose to join the STARSkate group lesson programs.

STARSkate (Intro Figure Skating) Program

The Junior Group Star Program (STAR 1-2 levels) and the Junior Star Program (STAR 3-5) under the STAR-Skate framework, are designed for skaters who have completed CanSkate Stage 4 or higher or for those who have progressed beyond the CanSkate program and would like to continue group lessons. Our program motivates skaters to learn in a group environment and progress at their own pace while developing their figure skating in Singles Skating, Skating Skills and Ice **Dance**. Skaters immersed in this program will have the opportunity to begin their Skate Canada STAR 1-5 Assessments through a Nationally standardized testing system and attend STAR 1-5 Competitions.

Adult Skate Program

The **Adult Skate Program** is growing in popularity and offers recreational, test and competitive opportunities to adult skaters 18 years and over. The Adult group lessons teach from basic to advanced levels of skating skills and movements, allowing skaters to learn in a fun, social environment.

Competitive Skate (Figure Skating) Program

The Competitive Skate program is for skaters in singles, pair and ice dance wishing to compete in qualifying events within Skate Canada. Skaters who wish to challenge their figure skating skills and who show potential as competitive skaters can participate in this program. This is the main competitive figure skating stream for those skaters who would like the opportunity to compete at Sectionals, Skate Canada Challenge and the Canadian National Figure Skating Championships. If skaters are interested in competitive figure skating, they can join the Competitive Skate Program supported by their Coach.

What a summer it has been! The summer of 2017 gave us a taste of heat and smoke but was nothing compared to what we have experienced this season. After surviving the hottest May in Calgary's history (after the ultrashort spring), we passed into a summer of BC fires, smoke, heat, air quality warnings, little effective precipitation and weird orange sunshine. The July and August garden grooming events, where the gardeners tend to the maintenance of the common areas of the garden, were scheduled for evenings on the assumption that the evenings would be cooler. It was a forlorn hope as the heat intensified in the early evening and several of the gardeners were unable to participate because of the ever-present smoke.

Despite the poor air conditions, garden production was a success story. Again, this summer, as noted last year, most of the perennials flowered early and once more there was a good crop of cherries and two of the apple trees were loaded with apples that also ripened earlier than anticipated (see photo). The two smaller apple trees had fewer flowers and only a few apples which were blown off during one of our very windy days in July. The haskap bushes, which usually flower in April, were delayed and when the flowers did appear, there were few pollinators around. Bee activity increased during May and later months, but the haskap did not produce any significant fruit. The severe winter damage to a few of the perennials has resulted in some permanent change, particularly to the barberry bushes, two of which will require aggressive pruning before winter. The potentilla, which was very slow to bloom, managed to rebound and was in full flower by mid-summer. The remaining perennials appear to have recovered well.

As is evident from the above, we gardeners are always lamenting the vagaries of Calgary weather, particularly the lack of rainfall during the growing season. As autumn arrives with cooler temperatures, we look forward to our main social event of the season, our annual Harvest Potluck, always a great ending to our gardening season.

A retail store means cannabis can be sold but not consumed on the premises. Cannabis related merchandise may also be sold.

Two retail locations have been approved in the Brentwood area:

- DP2018-1826 4122 Brentwood Rd NW, beside the Brentwood Co-op
- DP2018-1814 5505 Shaqanappi Trail NW, beside the Dalhousie Co-op

Two retail locations previously denied are being appealed by the applicants:

- DP2018-1944 1343 Northmount Dr. NW.
- DP2018-2251 1334 Northmount Dr. NW.

Information on Cannabis for Landlords and Tenants

With the smoking and growing of cannabis becoming legal, many property owners have questions around what that means for their Brentwood rental. If you have a rented home, suite or condo, you may wish to consider adding clauses to your lease. Here is what I've been able to find out from the Alberta Residential Landlord Association (www.albertalandlord.org) and the City of Calgary (http://www.calgary.ca/CSPS/ABS/Pages/Bylaws-by-topic/public-consumption-of-cannabis.aspx):

Smoking of Cannabis in a Rental Property

- A landlord may prohibit the smoking of all substances, including cannabis, in the rental property.
- The residential tenancy agreement should be clear on what is/is not allowed in the rental property.
- · Condominium corporations can also restrict smoking of substances through their bylaws – which will impact renters residing in a condo.

Growing of Cannabis in Rental Property

Under the proposed legislation – an individual will be allowed to grow up to 4 plants in their residences.

- A landlord could restrict growing in a new rental agreement or new agreements entered into at the end of a fixed term.
- Periodic agreements the landlord can approach tenant to mutually add to agreement - no obligation for tenant to agree/sign new lease.

Medicinal Marijuana:

- If the rental building is designated as smoke-free, then that would generally apply to any type of smoking.
- Tenants who use medical marijuana have other options for usage rather than smoking such as edibles, oils, etc.
- The landlord is not prohibiting these tenants from using their medication, just the form in which they are using it.

Using Cannabis on Private Property

- Under Provincial and Municipal laws, people will be allowed to smoke, vape or otherwise consume cannabis on their private property.
- The City of Calgary will not regulate use on private property.
- The City will view cannabis smoke in the same way as cigarette or fire-pit smoke. It may be annoying to some, but it is legal.
- · Unless smoke is over and above what one could expect from day-to-day activities, it is considered part and parcel of city living.

Allowing tenants to grow or smoke cannabis in your home or on your property may not be a concern for some landlords. If, however, you have concerns about future property values or potential insurance issues, here are two lease clauses that can be added to the lease agreement:

1. In consideration of the Landlord's desire to offer tenants a smoke-free environment, the health hazards associated to second hand smoke, other safety concerns and the nuisance caused by the presence of smoke including lasting odours which permeate walls, floor coverings and other interior finishes, these premises are strictly non-smoking. This prohibition includes the use of both tobacco and marijuana products which have undesirable effects on the property of the landlord and the peaceful enjoyment of other tenants. Breach of this prohibition will be considered a sub-

- stantial breach of the lease and, as a result, the landlord will take any and all action, including eviction.
- 2. In consideration of the nuisance smells, the property damage associated with increased indoor moisture levels, the danger of overburdened electrical systems, and safety concerns related to these things, there is a prohibition on the growth of marijuana in the premises. Further, in consideration of the nuisance smells associated with the production of marijuana derivatives and other deleterious effects caused by such activities, the production of marijuana derivatives is also strictly prohibited. Any breach of these prohibitions will be considered a substantial breach of the lease and, as a result, the landlord will take any and all action, including eviction.

Partners for Safety patrolling on Halloween night

Halloween should be spooky - not scary. The Calgary Partners for Safety have been patrolling the streets on Halloween night for more than 20 years to keep our little ghouls and goblins safe while they trick-or-treat! From 6:00 p.m.to 8:00 p.m. on October 31, more than 600 vehicles will be on Calgary's streets providing high-visibility assistance for anyone enjoying Halloween fun.

Coordinated by Calgary's Child Magazine, the Partners for Safety include the Calgary Police Service, Emergency Medical Services, Calgary Fire Department, Calgary Transit, Calgary Community Standards, Calgary Public Safety Communications (911), and Global Calgary. Any child experiencing a problem can go to any one of these partners for help.

Between regular emergency calls, the Calgary Police Service and Emergency Medical Services will have units patrolling residential neighbourhoods. The Calgary Fire Department will also have vehicles on patrol and fire stations will be open as a safe place for trick-or-treaters to ask for help if they need it.

Calgary Transit's buses and CTrains are in the community day and night providing essential transit services. On Halloween, if trick-or-treaters need help, they can approach any transit vehicle they spot. Bus and CTrain operators have radios and can contact the appropriate emergency personnel if needed.

There a number of exciting things to share with you this month:

The Annual General Meeting of the Friends of Nose Hill Society is coming soon. Watch for details of this and other news on our website at www.fonhs.org.

A public survey on City of Calgary Parks was posted at the City website Calgary.ca. The survey as well as public engagement are now closed, but you can learn about the results at: www.engage.calgary.ca/parksbylaw. The Updated Parks and Pathway Bylaw draft was presented to Council for approval in the fall. As part of the Bylaw review, information was gathered from reports, 3-1-1 calls, and best practices from other cities.

A citizen science initiative has been launched on the volunteer research website Zooniverse to enlist the help of Calgarians to "crowdsource" the identification of images. Go to the website: www.zooniverse.org/projects/calgarycaptured/calgary-captured for more information and to view the photos.

Shelley Alexander, a Professor at University of Calgary and an international expert in wild canid ecology (coyotes and wolves), lead a Jane's Walk on Nose Hill on May 4, 2018. The Jane's Walk website description was as follows:

"Beginning at the Many Owls Valley Parking lot (at Brisebois Drive) on Nose Hill, we will ascend the gentle slopes of this native grassland ecosystem, to the top where we will have a vantage of the Calgary cityscape and the undulating foothills parklands spanning west to the Rocky Mountain Front. Here we can view the world from the perspective of a coyote and understand the challenges they face living in this urban to wild gradient. Continuing our walk of the trail circuit, we will watch for signs of coyote (tracks/scat), discuss local research methods and findings, share fun facts about urban coyotes, and learn tips to help us live together and co-flourish.

Dogs and kids are welcome. This walk route is partly paved, partly grass/packed and gravel trail."

We thank Dr. Alexander for leading this as well as past Jane's Walks, and hope those who have attended them leave with further understanding of the urban coyote.
